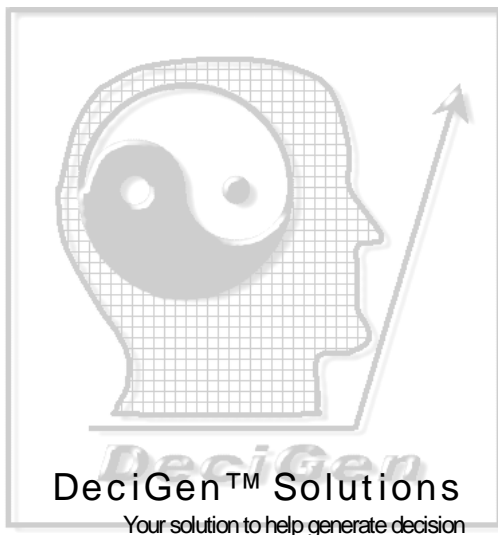

Introduction

DAMASCAS is a open source decision support system to generate optimum staff allocation after considering task requirement, skill and competency of your staff. It will also consider availability of manpower while planning the task allocation.

DAMASCAS will improve your team effectiveness and reduce the time wasted to distribute work, thereby increasing availability of your work force.

It is meant for first line supervisors - BPO team leaders, shop supervisor, office staff head, project leader. Who are faced with problem of day to day staff allocation to various tasks.

DAMASCAS is a free software. Free means – it can be freely copied on as many installation you want. It can also be freely distributed and even modified within the limitation of GNU Public License. Please read the License for more detail.

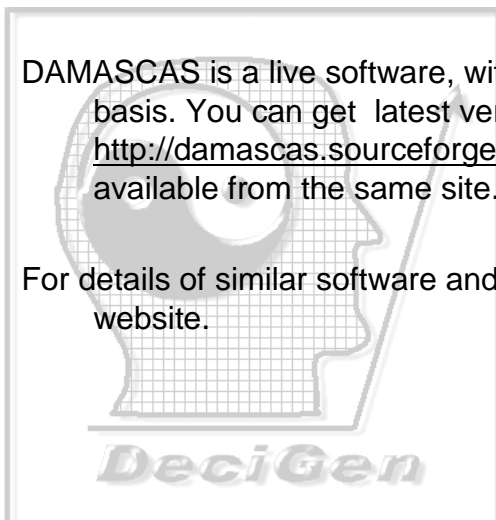
DAMASCAS requires information on work requirement, staff availability and skill database. It will find optimal assignment of various tasks to your workforce to ensure maximum work is allocated to highly skilled staffs.

It can respond to changes in your staff availability and work requirement and always find good allocation to ensure work is distributed to best skilled staff so that overall team productivity will always be maximum.

Downloading & Latest Version

User Licence

To install DAMASCAS run the setup file by double clicking it. This will show the flash screen and open the install directory. Please select any suitable directory as per your choice, and click on start setup.

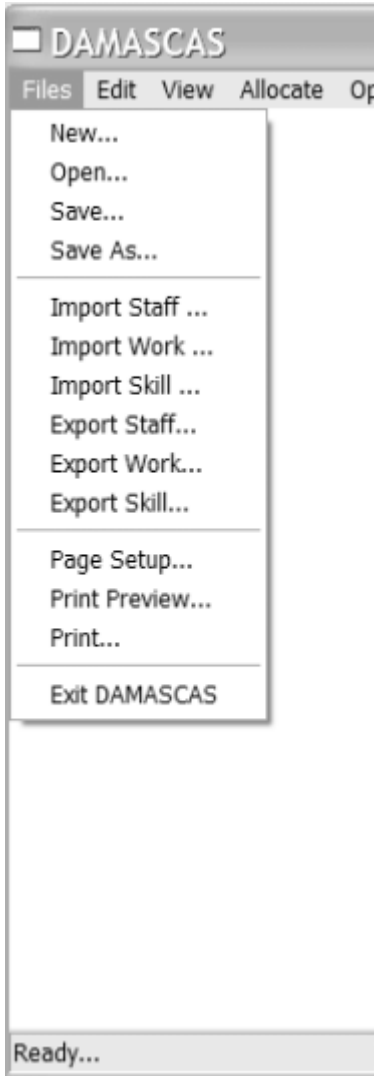
You will be presented with the user license. If the terms are acceptable to you, click on 'I agree' and software will be installed in your selected directory. The setup program will also create a program group in your start menu.

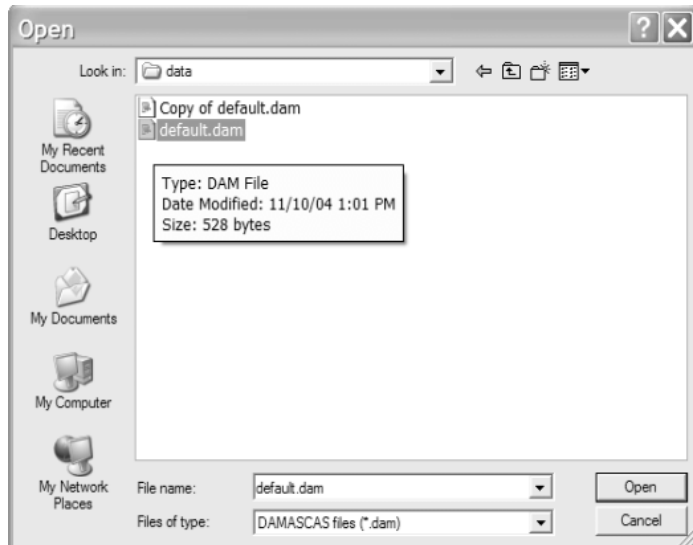
File Opening



You can get data from DAMASCAS (*.dam) files or import it from other files.

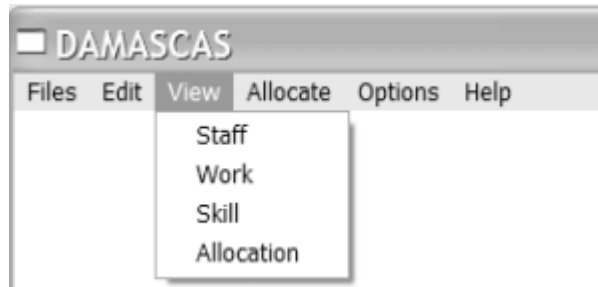
DAMASCAS can import data in comma separated value (.csv) from other program. This will allow you to easily integrate it with your existing programs like attendance system or Manpower planning system.

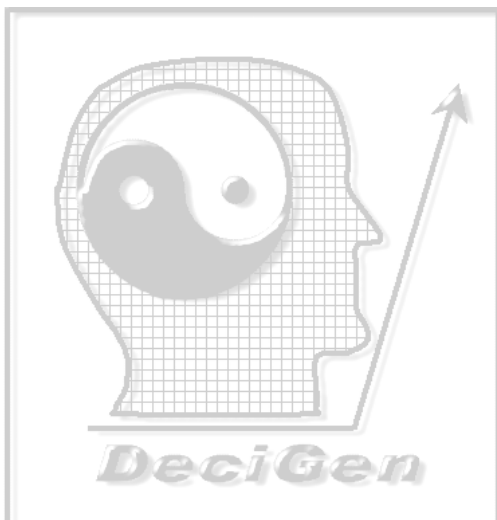

After all relevant data are loaded in the system you have to run Allocation by selecting "Allocation" from menu option.

This will find the best assignment of tasks for each of your staff. This allocation is done based on information available in skill matrix.

DAMASCAS tries to allocate task to the best skilled staffs.

After allocation has been done skill matrix will show the allocations by highlighting the cells that has been allocated

Data Preparation

For staff allocation three types of data are required

1. List of staffs along with their presence: This can be imported through a comma separated list. First field should indicate the staff name and second field should indicate attendance status. All present staff should have 1 after their name and all absent staffs should have 0
2. Work requirement: This is again a comma separated list. First field should indicate the skill name and second field should indicate total staff requirement for that skill
3. Skill matrix: This is a comma separated list of skill of your staffs in 0 to 10 scale. Each line indicate skill for one staff. Skill columns must match in the order Skills are entered in work data file. I.e. first column is for first item in work data, second column for second item and so on. Higher number indicate higher skilled staff. Provide data for all work category and all staffs, otherwise the program may generate run time error or give erroneous results
